Cleanup Procedures: Collect all contaminated clay, media, or other cleanup materials into a waste receptacle. If cleaning surface is necessary, utilize mineral spirits or other solvents, provided adequate ventilation is available.

Safe Handling Precautions: Do not handle until all safety precautions have been read and understood. Do not handle near an open flame or sources of ignition. Ensure adequate ventilation. Take precautionary measures against static discharges. Avoid breathing vapors. Avoid contact with eyes, skin, and clothing. Avoid prolonged exposure. Wear appropriate personal protective equipment. Always wash hands after handling material.

Recommendations for Storage: Store in cool area in product container away from sources of ignition or flame. Never store in extreme temperatures and avoid storing in direct sunlight.
